Dear Families and Students,

Welcome back to school for what has been an amazing start to 2023. It has been great catching up with students and chatting with families in the yard. The school is buzzing with excitement and we are glad to be back. Timetable

Welcome/Attendance

Hi everyone and welcome back! Whether you are new or returning to our school, it's great to have you here at Salisbury North & part of our school community! It has been so nice to return to school with very few restrictions, students have been able to access all educational, social and emotional opportunities that attending school provides. At Salisbury North we aim for at least 90% + attendance for all students. We understand things arise, such as illness, appointments, etc. If and when life gets in the way of school attendance, please contact the school when your child is absent. This can be done by either messaging your child's teacher via SEESAW or making a call through to the school. When students are regularly late to school, they miss daily instructions and routines and may feel embarrassed, awkward, uncertain or unhappy. A child that is 10 minutes late every day will miss 30 hours of instruction over the year. Research shows that daily school attendance is crucial for children to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially and developmentally. It is important that students develop habits of regular attendance at an early age. You can help your child to be ready and on time for school each day by:

- Preparing for school the night before by making lunches and packing bags
- Having a regular and consistent bedtime routine
- · Positively priming students about the school day ahead
- Removing technology from the bedroom at night
- Modelling punctual behaviour for work/appointments

Assemblies

On Monday, Week 3 we had our first official Whole School Assembly. The year 2 cohort did an incredible job hosting and presenting. Assemblies will be Monday's of week 3, 6 & 9 each term, at 2:15pm in our gym. Please keep an eye out on SEESAW for when your child's class will be hosting/presenting. Canteen Update



Over the Counter Accounts

Canteen Accounts are available for families who wish to have the convenience of not having to find last minute lunch order money or for students who'd rather not carry money & risk losing it in the yard. It's a great option for younger students and alleviates the temptation or peer pressure to spend on others by setting a daily spending limit.

Families can open up a Canteen Account by either purchasing <u>"Over the Counter" credit online via Spriggy Schools or</u> by dropping <u>CASH</u> in to either the Front Office in a named envelope or directly to the Canteen.

Students can then place lunch orders through their classroom lunch baskets or purchase snacks/ice blocks/drinks etc over the counter during break times and the total amount will be deducted from your account balance.

Our Canteen Manager keeps records of all purchases on your account and a copy of your account can be sent home at any time on request. A list of all students with a canteen account is kept behind the counter & students are able to check their account total at anytime.

Text messages are also sent out to families to let them know when their account has become low on funds. If you need any assistance with opening a Canteen Account, please don't hesitate to contact the Canteen.
