Dear Parents and Carers,

We've enjoyed a wonderful and positive return to the school term. Our students have been engaged in their learning and it is wonderful to see them thriving in the classroom once again.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who attended the Governing Council parent coffee and conversation catch up. I look forward to hearing all of the wonderful fundraising ideas that came as a result of your meeting. We value your input and appreciate the time and effort you put into making our school community even stronger.

We are making great progress on our Site Improvement Plan. This term, we are focusing on reading fluency, which is an essential component of the Big 6. We have collected data using the DIBELS Oral Reading Fluency assessment and are using this data to inform our teaching practice. In Weeks 3, 6 and 9 our teachers will learn and commit to practicing specific strategies that will support reading fluency. We look forward to seeing the outcomes of this! As you may be aware, the Blue Units on our school site are set to be demolished in the near future. We are starting to gather ideas from staff and students on how to replace them for our students. We want to ensure that we create an environment that is not only safe but also engaging and inspiring for our students. We look forward to hearing ideas from the community in the future!

I ask parents and carers to please talk to their children about the importance of school pride and respecting school property. We have had multiple instances of vandalism in the student toilets this term, which is not only disappointing but also costs a lot of money to repair. In the future, we would like to make our toilets a nicer environment for our students and we look forward to gathering ideas from our students on how we could do that. We believe that by instilling a sense of pride and ownership in our students, we can make change in this area. Another aspect of school pride is our students wearing the correct school uniform. School staff will be following up on students not wearing the correct school uniform by texting families. Student Review Team (SRT)

The SRT is a group of staff that meet once a term to review and monitor the progress of students who require support through the involvement of Student Support Services (SSS).

The team comprises of the Principal, the Inclusion and Intervention Coordinator, the Wellbeing Leader, a SSS Behaviour Support Coach, a SSS Special Educator and a SSS Speech Pathologist.

Teachers refer students to the SRT when they observe factors that are causing barriers to their learning. These barriers can include difficulties with speech, hearing, cognitive ability, managing behaviour and impulse control and chronic absenteeism.

Referrals are reviewed by the SRT and if necessary the student is referred to SSS. Before referring a student to SSS a school staff member will meet with the student's parent/carer to discuss the concerns raised and gain their consent.

Once consent has been given, the student is referred to one or more areas of SSS. These areas include Aboriginal Education Services, Behaviour Support Coaches, Psychology, Truancy, Special Educators, Special Educators – Hearing and Speech Pathology.

In most instances, a member of SSS will observe the student and write a report which includes recommendations for the teacher/school to implement to better support the student. If necessary, a Speech Pathology and/or a Cognitive Assessment can be performed, or students can be referred to the Child Development Unit (CDU) for an Autism or Developmental Assessment.

If this information has raised any questions, please send me an email or contact the school to arrange a time to speak with me. Ensuring that students receive the support they need to be successful is of utmost importance to me.

Nature Play Incursion

On Tuesday, May 4th, all students participated in a Nature Play incursion. Students were provided with a unique opportunity to engage in a variety of nature-inspired activities, fostering their creativity, imagination, exploration, and discovery.

Throughout the day, our students participated in a range of activities including cubby building, potion making, mask and crown making and wooden block play. Additionally, they enjoyed flying kites and utilized water paints and pictures of birds and animals to recreate their own masterpieces.

One of the highlights of the day was the freedom given to the students to choose their activities. They had the option to stay at one activity and fully immerse themselves in their creativity, or they could move between activities at their own free will. This autonomy and choice empowered our students, enabling them to follow their interests and engage in activities that resonated with them personally. The Nature Play incursion aimed to support our students in developing important skills such as resilience, problem-solving, teamwork, and communication. By engaging in hands-on activities and collaborating with their peers, students learned to navigate challenges, express their ideas, and work together towards a common goal. These experiences fostered a strong sense of agency and community among our students, encouraging them to take ownership of their learning and to value the contributions of others.

The Nature Play incursion was a tremendous success, and we witnessed the joy and enthusiasm in our students and teachers as they wholeheartedly engaged in the activities. We are delighted to have been able to provide such a meaningful opportunity.
