


A Note from our Assistant Principal Dear families,

What a fast-paced term it has been! As we hit the half-way point of term 2, I would like to take this time to look back at an incredible experience some of our Nunga students had as part of Reconciliation Week and Sorry Day. I will also be providing some information regarding Semester 1 reports which will be completed and sent home in the last week of school.

The Colebrook excursion is one that our year 5 and 6 Nunga students attended a long with, Aunty Deb, Robbie, Phil and Ms Angela. Colebrook Home was established in Quorn, South Australia, in 1927 as an institution for Aboriginal children, aiming to assimilate them into white society. The United Aborigines Mission (UAM) ran the home, initially starting with a small cottage and later relocating to a property in Eden Hills, Adelaide. Matron Ruby Hyde, assisted by Sister Rutter, managed the home for many years. In 1952, Sisters Hyde and Rutter left to start their own hostel, and Colebrook went through several changes in management. It closed in 1981, and former residents formed the Colebrook Tji Tji Tjuta, working with the Blackwood Reconciliation Group to erect a memorial at the Eden Hills site. The memorial honours the children who grew up in Colebrook and the mothers who were separated from them.

The significance of attending the excursion was to allow students a real-life look at what life was like for Aboriginal people. The experience was very heart-felt for everyone who attended. Here are some pictures that capture the memories and emotions of the day.


