#### Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Salisbury North Primary School will be participating in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD). All schools in Australia are required to collect this information to inform improved support for students with disability. This data must be submitted by the 4th of August. The following information is from the NCCD website:

#### What is the NCCD?

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year. The NCCD is a collection of data that includes:

- The number of students receiving adjustments/support due to disability
- The level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to a diagnosed or imputed disability. The NCCD uses the broad definition of disability in the Disability Discrimination Act 1992.

What must schools do for students with disability?

All students have the right to a quality learning experience at school.

Students with disability must be able to take part in education without discrimination and on the same basis as other students. To ensure this, schools must make reasonable adjustments if needed for students with disability. Educators, students, parents, guardians, carers and others (eg health professionals) must work together to ensure that students with disability can take part in education.

The Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005 describe schools' responsibilities.

#### What is a reasonable adjustment?

An adjustment is an action to help a student with disability take part in education on the same basis as other students.

Adjustments can be made across the whole school (e.g. ramps into school buildings). They can be in the classroom (e.g. adapting teaching methods). They can also be for individual student need (e.g. providing personal care support).

#### What information is collected?

Each year, schools collect the following information about the students included in the NCCD:

- Their year of schooling
- The level of adjustment received (Quality Differentiated Teaching Practice, Supplementary, Substantial or Extensive)
- The broad type of disability (Physical, Cognitive, Sensory, Social/Emotional)

For students who have more than one disability, the school uses professional judgement to choose one category of disability. They choose the category that most affects the student's access to education and for which adjustments are being provided.

How is students' privacy protected?

Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD.

Data is collected within each school. Personal details, such as student names or student identifiers, are not provided to federal education authorities.



## A Note from our Assistant Principal



In Term 3 our Year 1 students will once again participate in the Phonics Screening Check with a focus on continuing the improvement demonstrated state-wide since 2018. The target for our site is that 95% of students in Year 1 will achieve the Standard of Education Achievement in Phonics as measured by the phonics screening check. Teachers have been critically reflecting upon their practice to refine their knowledge and skills in implementing a systematic, explicit approach to phonics through a whole site literacy commitment.

The Phonics Screening Check assesses students ability to recognize and understand the alphabetical code, 44 sounds and corresponding letter/diagraphs and apply phonic principles to decode unknown and pseudo words. Pseudo words are included to determine students ability to truly sound out and blend.

Our Year 1 teachers have been participating in professional learning to enhance their practice and impact on student outcomes. More information about the Phonics Screening will be provided closer to the time of assessment (Term 3).

Processes are underway for the intake of Receptions for 2024. If you have a child that turns 5 before the 1st of November 2024, they will be eligible to start school either in January or July. Please collect a registration of interest form from your Kindy or from the school front office and return to the front office of Salisbury North Primary School by the 12th April.
