A Note From the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

As the weather warms up, we now reach the end of Term 3. It's hard to believe that Term 4 is approaching already! We say it every year, but this year really has flown by!

I'd like to start with an important reminder to please prioritise road safety on Bagster Road and model safe ways to cross the road for our students at the beginning and end of day. Lately, we have noticed a lot of students running across the road in front of the pedestrian gate which puts them at risk of serious injury. EDI is a research-based teaching strategy that focuses on delivering clear, structured, and systematic lessons to students. This learning connected to the work we are doing with Positive Behaviour for Learning and the Gradual Release Model, and what teachers have been exposed to regarding Cognitive Load Theory. Teachers made commitments to use specific strategies that align to Rosenshine's Principles in the classroom. The learning from the day provides a baseline and will inform how we teach across the curriculum moving forward, which is very exciting!

Lastly, we wish all families a happy two-week break and look forward to a productive and exciting Term 4. See you next term!

A Note from our Assistant Principal

ATSI STEM Competition

Dear Salisbury North Community,

A few weeks ago, some of our ATSI students were invited to Lake Windermere to participate in a STEM competition. The students were tasked with designing either a smart city or a smart farm. They had to plan, create a model, and even code to ensure the functionality of their farm. We teamed up with Paralowie School and were excited to have Ms. Tina join us!

The models were then transported to the Royal Adelaide Show, where they underwent judgment based on their design, practicality, and the success of their coding efforts. Below, you'll find a write-up completed by our students:

We, the Year 6 Aboriginal students from Salisbury North Primary School and Paralowie School, teamed up to work on something really cool for a STEM competition. Our mission was to create something that could help with the high energy costs and also be good for the environment. So, we put on our thinking caps and came up with an awesome idea: a SMART farm!

Our SMART farm is all about using the power of the sun to make things better. We wanted to make sure that the plants in a greenhouse stay happy and healthy even when it gets superhot. We learned that when the temperature goes above 27 degrees Celsius, plants can start to wilt because it's too hot for them. That's where our technology comes in.

We designed a special system that uses solar power to keep the greenhouse cool. Whenever the temperature goes over 27 degrees Celsius, our system kicks into action. It turns on a fan that starts cooling down the greenhouse. This is way better than using gas to heat or cool the greenhouse like most people do. We thought it would be awesome to use the power of the sun to solve this problem!

We programmed the system ourselves with the help of the STEM team. We also managed to run the system off a battery which is also something we will be exploring as a sustainable way moving forward.

We thought about the environment. Instead of using gas for energy, we're using solar power. That means we're not making as much pollution, and we're helping to take care of our planet.

But our plans don't stop at the competition. We want to bring our SMART farm idea to life in our own schools. We're excited to use solar power to keep our school greenhouses at the perfect temperature. This way, we can grow healthy food in a way that's good for the Earth.

And guess what? We've also added a special touch to our greenhouse. We put the Aboriginal flag on it, along with some Kaurna words. We're on Kaurna land, and we want to show respect to all the people who call this land home. It's important to us to remember our ancestors who took care of this land, and now it's our turn. We hope that by including the flag and the words, we can inspire other Aboriginal kids to get into farming and inventing, just like we did.

Working on this project together showed us how science and technology can make a real difference. We're proud of our SMART farm idea and we're excited to keep exploring ways to use STEM to create a better future.
