On the 23rd of September 13 of our students performed on stage at the Adelaide Festival Theatre as part of the Public Primary Schools Festival of Music.

The Primary Schools Festival of Music, an official state icon, and custodian of an iconic South Australian tradition, engages our students in artistic excellence, cultural diversity and social inclusion through performance in Music and the Arts.

Inspections are conducted unannounced by the Salisbury Council and premises must meet strict hygiene & food safety guidelines to achieve a Food Safety Rating.

The Canteen is open 5 days a week for Healthy Snack, Lunch & Recess and offers healthy choices over the counter during break times from .50c - \$2.50.
