Department for Education OSHC Survey

Dear parents and carers,

As you know, we have sought feedback from families regarding the need for an Out of School Hours Care service on site and off site at Salisbury North for the past couple of years. Unfortunately, we've not had the level of interest that could justify an on-site service and the offsite providers have not been willing or able to give us a straight answer. This is frustrating and I apologise this situation.

Now, the Department for Education is seeking our help to inform the future planning for Out of School Hours Care (OSHC) services across the state. You are invited to participate in a survey which will seek your feedback regarding your potential needs for an OSHC service, to better understand the demand in our community and across the state.

Rolleston Road – After School Pick Up

we are implementing an additional after-school yard duty at the gate on Rolleston Road. Key Changes and Expectations:

1. Gate Supervision: A dedicated staff member will be stationed at the gate on Rolleston Road

during after-school hours to ensure supervision and security.

2. Student Protocol: For the safety of all students, we kindly request that students remain inside

the gate on Rolleston Road until they see their parent or guardian for pick-up.

3. Parent Responsibility: We ask parents and guardians to promptly arrive for pick-up at the designated gate and ensure clear communication with your child regarding this new protocol.

These measures are designed to enhance supervision and provide a secure environment for all students during after-school hours. We appreciate your cooperation and support in adhering

to these guidelines for the safety and well-being of our school community.

CHILDREN'S UNIVERSITY



Bullying No Way National week of action

Bullying – important conversations to have with your child

Salisbury North Primary School is participating in the Bullying No Way: National week of action – 12 to 16 August 2024.

By working collaboratively within our community, we can collectively help reduce bullying.

Parents and carers play an important role in helping your child understand bullying, and know how to respond to it.

If your child tells you about things at school, or you observe something in public that involves conflict or bullying, take the opportunity to talk about what bullying is. You can learn more about what defines bullying at bullyingnoway.gov.au.

Questions you could ask:

- □ What do you think bullying is?
- □ Have you seen it? How did you feel?
- \square Have you ever felt scared at school because of bullying?
- \square As well as me, who are the other adults you would talk to when it comes to things like bullying?
- Have you or your friends left other kids out on purpose? Do you think that was bullying? Why or why not?
- Have you ever tried to help someone who is being bullied? What happened? What would you do if it happens again?

Remind your child that bullying is never okay and discuss how they can respond safely if they experience or witness it.

Encourage them to seek help from a trusted adult and keep seeking support if needed.

By promoting open communication, we empower children to stand up against bullying and create a safer environment where everyone can feel that they belong.

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
OUR FIRST WEEKS OF SCHOOL
