


A Note From the Principal continued......

Dear Parents and Families

As we enter Week 3 of Term 1, 2024, our students continue to further engage in their learning. As a school staff, we've set clear focus areas for 2024: Academic Improvement, Student Support, and School Culture.

Academic Improvement underscores our commitment to ensuring that every student achieves academic growth. We aim to equip them with essential skills that will not only serve them academically but also provide choices for their future. Literacy, particularly reading, remains pivotal, and we are emphasizing explicit teaching strategies to support student learning. This year, our staff will continue to enhance their abilities in supporting students in this regard.



Student Support is a broad focus encompassing the holistic development of our students in various aspects of their schooling

and life. This involves cultural awareness, social skills, emotional management, and addressing behavioural needs. Our recently introduced whole-school reward system is a prime example of our dedication to fostering positive student development.

Being part of such a warm and welcoming community is a privilege. School Culture, therefore, pertains to the interactions and collaborations among staff, students, parents, and community members, all united in the common goal of supporting our students.

Our commitment to keeping students at the core of everything we do remains unwavering, and we will keep you informed about our progress in these areas throughout the year.

In other news, next week, the SNPS Principal position will be advertised for a 5-year tenure. Our Education Director, Sue George-Duif, will lead the panel process, ensuring a fair and equitable selection. Lastly, we've observed some students arriving late, between 8:45 am and 9:00 am. Timely attendance is crucial, as 5 minutes late daily amounts to 25 minutes of lost learning per week and over 4 hours per term. We appreciate your efforts in ensuring punctuality.

A Note from the Assistant Principal

A Friendly Reminder for School Drop-Off and Pick-Up

Dear Salisbury North Primary School Parents and Guardians,

We have received a number of reports about road rage incidents, and local resident's driveways being blocked by parked cars during school drop-off and pick-up times. While acknowledging that pick-up and drop-off can be stressful for parents/guardians and students, it is important that we set a good example for our children.

We can do this by managing driving and parking around our school with patience and respect. By avoiding the urge to use offensive language, make threats or engage in confrontations, we create a safer environment for everyone.

Practical Tips for Positive Drop-Offs and Pick-Ups:

1. Plan Ahead: Allow extra time for drop-off and pick-up to reduce stress and rushing

2. Follow the Traffic Rules: Adhere to parking regulations around our school

3. Be Patient: Take a deep breath, and remember that we are all in this together

4. Use Kind Words: A friendly gesture or a polite comment can go a long way supporting a positive environment for all

5. Report Concerns: If you observe inappropriate behaviour, report it to the school rather than confronting the individual directly.

Additionally, we received a visit from a traffic management officer from the Salisbury Council who discussed their plans for supporting a safer pick up and drop off experience for students and families.

Firstly, a fence along the median strip of Bagster Road will be erected in the coming months. This has been promised by the council for over a year and is finally happening! The contractors are aiming for Easter as their installation date. This will ensure that all students and families use the designated pedestrian crossings. It will also affect parking restrictions along Bagster Road and will make the Eastern side a "kiss and drop zone" with restricted hours for extended parking. More information will be sent about these changes in the coming weeks.

A pedestrian island and access ramps will also be installed next to the pedestrian gate on Rolleston Avenue. This will slow traffic down and provide pedestrians with a refuge when crossing the road. This is a long-term plan and requires community consultation before work commences. We expect this work to commence in late 2024 or early 2025.

Children's University

Our students from years 3-6 have the opportunity to be part of the Children's University (CU) program again for 2024. CU aims to encourage high quality out of school activities for children, engaging with the wider community as learning partners. The program builds confidence in learning for students where they are able to take ownership of their learning.

Students will keep a passport of their learning journey to track educational activities in which they take part in & their will be a graduation at the end of the year for students who participate in a minimum of 30hours.

The annual fee for CU is \$26.50 (inc. GST) which includes one passport per membership year (if required) Any second or subsequent passport in the same membership year will incur a fee of \$7.70 (inc. GST)
