Governing Council Update

Last week, we had our first Governing Council (GC) meeting of 2025. Thank you to our GC parent and community members who have committed their valuable time and energy to the progress of our school. Improvement as Learning and Wellbeing in the Yard

Throughout this term, classes have, for the most part, been very settled with students engaged in their learning. However, we have noticed a spike in minor incidents of violence during unstructured play in the yard. Staff unpacked our yard behaviour data during Pupil Free Day in Week 6 and believe that there are a number of actions that we can take to support more positive behaviour choices in the yard. They include clearly identifying expectations and boundaries in the yard



providing additional supervision and student support, providing more engaging activities for play in the yard and developing student's social and emotional skills. Recently, you may have noticed the first step in action throughout the school yard with new red boundaries and yard specific expectations displayed in particular areas (see images).

Educators have now gone to work in guiding our students to make better choices in those areas. New expectations and boundaries are reviewed with students before break times and "Plans for Play" are created with students to support class into transition from the vard. Students have brainstormed different games to play in specific yard areas, then begun practicing these games during fitness or at other opportunities. Supervision in the yard has been increased with all staff members looking for students displaying school values, rewarding them with PBL leaves when appropriate and supporting students to engage in play successfully. After break, classes use circle time to discuss what went well and challenges from the yard, working through challenges together to support future success. The focus for staff is on using preventative strategies to support students rather than reactive consequences as much as possible.

We are only a couple of days in, but we are already seeing a big difference, which is wonderful! The next step is to work

alongside students and consider how we can make the yard a more engaging place by seeking their ideas and suggestions. Then, we will consider other opportunities for building student's social skills and emotional regulation. This is a process that will take time and we look forward to continuing our work on this!

Hats in the Yard


As part of our yard review, it has been decided that students and educators <u>will wear hats</u> <u>outside in Terms 1, 2, 3 and 4</u> rather than just in Terms 1, 3 and 4. This decision was made to support student sun safety and ensure consistency and predictability for students which will minimize uncertainty. We will send a reminder to families early in Term 2. OSHC Update

After a number of false starts and dead-end roads, Governing Council is seeking an OSHC for our site via a third-party provider. By the end of this term, I will have submitted our application and it will then go out for tender with prospective OSHC providers. This process can take 6 months but we are hoping that it will have a positive outcome for our families. Thank you for your patience. I will keep families updated as we hear more.

Rolleston Avenue – Indented Parking Bay "Kiss and Drop Zone"

Works for the Rolleston Avenue indented parking bay will commence on the 14th of April anticipated and is to be completed during Week 2 of Term 2, which is fantastic news! This will likely cause some disruptions for the usual flow of traffic, so where possible I would advise using this street minimally during this period. The parking bay will be a "Kiss and Drop Zone" for quick drop offs and pickups, not extended parking during peak times. Surrounding areas will also be impacted with altered line markings and parking restrictions, so please be vigilant. It encourages predictability, routines and explicit teaching to students of the expected behaviours we want for our school community. When students follow these whole school behaviours they receive a value leaf. Together students are showing teamwork to reach our whole school rewards. A Note From the Assistant Principal

As we continue our journey to enhance the educational experience at Salisbury North Primary School, we're excited to share some key developments in our teaching approach. These changes align with the South Australian Strategy for Public Education, where we aim to equip our students with the skills they need to thrive in an ever-changing world.

This term, our teachers have transitioned from the PLD spelling program to the Department for Education's new framework and scope and sequence. This shift brings us in line with many schools across South Australia and ensures our teaching practices are grounded in the latest research and best practices.

This new framework opens the door for teachers to introduce morphology from Reception level. Morphology—the study of word structure and formation—helps students understand the meanings of morphemes (the smallest units of meaning in a language). By developing an early awareness of how words are built, students strengthen their vocabulary, reading, and writing skills.

On our recent Pupil Free Day, teachers attended a work shop called, "Word Cracker." This training focused on creative ways to teach morphemes and how they can be manipulated to form words. Our teachers left the session equipped with new strategies to make morphology learning both fun and effective for our students. The training uses mini-matrices (see below) to support word building by showing prefixes, roots/bases, and suffixes that students can manipulate to build words. Building students morphological awareness helps students' problem-solve words they do not know how to read and spell yet.

We're committed to fostering an environment where all students can thrive, and these new teaching strategies are an important step in that direction. By building strong literacy and numeracy foundations, we're giving our students the tools they need to succeed in their learning journey and beyond.

Students participated in Harmony Week activities with their classes, and contributed to a beautiful whole school display of recognition that everyone belongs.








Harmony week is the celebration that recognises our diversity and brings together Australians from all different backgrounds. It's about inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for everyone.
