A Note From the Principal

Dear parents and carers,

Welcome to Term 2!

It's been a settled and positive start to the term, and it's been great to see students return ready to learn and reconnect with their classmates and teachers. Classrooms are humming along, and we're continuing to build on the strong foundations set in Term 1.

Wellbeing in the Yard – Update

In our last newsletter in Week 9 of Term 1, we shared some of the strategies we had begun to implement to improve student wellbeing, safety and engagement in the yard. These included:

- Creating clear expectations and physical boundaries for yard areas.
- Increasing staff presence and supervision during break times.
- Making "Plans for Play" before break times to support students to engage in positive play through pre-teaching games and activities.
- Reflecting on break times when returning to class through class community circles.



A Note From the Principal continued......

We're pleased to report that these strategies have made a significant difference. This term, we've introduced a number of new clubs and activities during breaks, including Board Games Club, Art Club, Dance Club, Giant Connect 4, and Sports Club. These have been a big hit with students and have further strengthened our positive yard culture.

Five weeks on, we've seen a dramatic drop in low-level incidents and a noticeable lift in student engagement in the yard. Games like What's the Time Mr Wolf, Marco Polo and netball are now a common sight, as are collaborative projects like sand sculptures and "base" building with natural objects.

Educators reinforce positive behaviour with PBL leaves, and students are motivated by the recognition and rewards. If you get a chance, ask your child what they played at break today. Even better—can you teach them a schoolyard game you loved playing as a child? We'd love to see it come to life in our yard!

PBL Token Tank

Our students have been doing an amazing job making positive choices both in the classroom and the yard—and their efforts are paying off! We've already reached the second checkpoint on our PBL token tank! This is a huge achievement and a testament to the collective effort of our students and staff.

Rolleston Avenue Roadworks Update


Everyone enjoyed their snack bag and drink, seeing the animals, participating in activities, having a sausage sizzle and getting an easter egg.


