Dear Families,

This semester, we have been dedicated to fostering a strong culture and proud voices among our Aboriginal students. We are excited to share the cultural pride and enthusiasm growing at Salisbury North Primary School, where our students are actively learning and celebrating the Kaurna language under the guidance of Uncle Robbie.

Uncle Robbie and our students have been working on renaming our Sports Day teams. The original names of our sport day teams were Bagster, Woodyates, Rolleston & Downton. These have now been replaced with names in the Kaurna language, focusing on animals that are meaningful and culturally significant.

A diverse group of students, both Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal, collaborated to research, discuss, and select these names. They explored Kaurna colour words and animal names, and all classes participated in voting.
